

# **POOL BARRIER INSPECTION**

QBCC have 2 pool categories

- 1. Residential
- 2. Shared Pools

Swimming pool safety laws set by QBCC aim to minimise the chance that young children can get into the pool area unsupervised. This means all Pool barrier standards are the same for both shared pools and residential pools but for the public's safety the QBCC have applied 2 stricter rules that apply only to shared pools.

- QBCC Form 23 Pool Safety Certificate
- Shared pools will be put into our system for reminder notice one month before your current certificates expiry date

It is expected by Queensland local councils that Residential pool owners know ALL pools should comply with QBCC regulations 100% of the time with no exceptions Your local council is authorised to check your pool complies non-compliance fines could apply, please see your local council for more details:

If you are leasing or selling a property with a pool you must have a valid pool safety certificate. Residential pools and spa certificates are valid for two years.

### **SHARED POOLS**

What is a shared Pool?

QBCC state that - A shared pool means that it is accessible to residents of two or more dwellings. They are typically associated with apartment and unit complexes, hotels, motels, backpacker hostels and caravan parks.

#### 1. HOW LONG IS A POOL SAFETY CERTIFICATE VALID FOR

A pool safety certificate confirms that your pool complied with the pool safety standard at the time it was checked by a pool safety inspector.

Pool safety certificates are valid for:

- 1 year for shared pools
- 2 years for non-shared pools.

#### 2. RULES FOR DISPLAYING CERTIFICATES

Shared pools must display their current pool safety certificate near the main entrance to the premises or at a gate or door accessing the pool. Your local council may impose fines if certificates are not being displayed.

Owners of non-shared pools do not have to display a current pool safety certificate. If you have already received a certificate but have lost it, you can download and print

a new one from QBCC pool register https://my.qbcc.qld.gov.au/s/pool-register

**CPR** signs

The pool safety standard also covers pool safety signs:

- you must display a compliant CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) sign.
- the CPR sign must be attached to the pool fence or barrier, or somewhere near the pool so it is conspicuous and anyone near the pool can see it.
